Sons of America's Fallen Learn to Shave From Military and Veteran Mentors

TAPS Mentors step in to ensure a moment traditionally shared with Dad is memorable for sons grieving fathers who served in the US military

WHAT Learning to shave is a rite of passage a young man traditionally experiences with his dad. It's more than a first shave, it's a moment of bonding and vulnerability when father and son watch as a boy becomes a man in the mirror. The sons of America's fallen can't share this moment with their dads. But, through the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS) shaving experience, these surviving sons will still have a memorable first shave alongside their Military Mentor — a current or veteran U.S. service member who volunteers to support the bereaved children of their fallen brothers and sisters in arms.

The TAPS shaving experience was recently featured in the April issue of TIME magazine, when TAPS — in partnership with Gillette and TIME's content division Red Border — was named this year's **TIME101** as part of the publication's annual list of the **TIME100** most influential people. Over Memorial Day weekend, in the nation's capital, nearly 50 surviving teen boys will experience their first shave with the guidance and support of their Military Mentor at the 30th Annual TAPS National Military Survivor Seminar and Good Grief Camp.

It's an experience they will recall each time they shave, and they will recall the support of a caring mentor who ensured they did not face this rite of passage alone.
